Two-part verbs



- Two-part verbs are (verb + Particle)
- If the object of a two-part verb is a noun, the noun can come before or after the particle , for example:
 - Take out the trash or Take the trash out.
- If the object is a pronoun, the pronoun must come before the particle, for example:
 - Take it out not Take out it .

Requests and Responses



- Please turn down the music.
- Ok, I will turn it down.

- Put away your books, please.
- All right, I will put them away.

- Pick up your socks, please.
- Ok, I will pick them up.

Requests with Modals and Would you mind...?



- Requests with modals and Would you mind...? Are polite even without please. For instance, "Can you get me a sandwich?" sounds much more polite than "Get me a sandwich."
- Use the base form of the verb, not the infinitive (to + base form) with modals can, could, and would. For example:
- **Could** you **get** me a sandwich?
- Not could you to get me a sandwich?

Requests with Modals and Would you mind...?



Modal + Base form verb	Would you mind+ gerund
Can you keep your cat inside, please?	Would you mind keeping your cat inside?
Could you turn the music down, please?	Would you mind turning the music down, please?
Would you please park your car in your space?	Would you mind not parking your car in my space?
