Future perfect

Form

The future perfect is composed of two elements
the simple future of the verb "to have" (will have) + the past participle of
the main verb

Subject	+ will have	+ past participle of the main verb
He	will have	finished.
I	will have	finished.

To arrive, future perfect tense

Affirmative	Negative	Interrogative	Negative interrogative
I will have	I won't have	Will I have	Won't I have arrived?

Affirmative	Negative	Interrogative	Negative interrogative
arrived	arrived	arrived?	
You will have arrived	You won't have arrived	Will you have arrived?	Won't you have arrived?
He will have arrived	He won't have arrived	Will he have arrived?	Won't he have arrived?
We will have arrived	We won't have arrived	Will we have arrived?	Won't we have arrived?
They will have arrived	They won't have arrived	Will they have arrived?	Won't they have arrived?

Function

The future perfect tense refers to a completed action in the future. When we use this tense we are projecting ourselves forward into the future and looking back at an action that will be completed sometime later than now. It is most often used with a time expression.

Examples

- **I will have been here for six months on June 23rd.**
- **By the time you read this I will have left.**
- **You will have finished your report by this time next week.**
- **Won't they have arrived by 5:00?**
- **Will you have eaten when I pick you up?**
